**ALL PARTICIPANTS MUST BE PRE-REGISTERED AND PART OF A UNIT TO ATTEND.
WALK-INS WILL BE TURNED AWAY.**

Artillery units must have a three pounder or larger with full crew compliment to take part in tacticals. Rounds will be made on-site under staff supervision. No pre-rolled rounds are allowed. Guns are subject to inspection by site staff.

All participants must check-in at the registration area at the time of arrival.

Wood and water are provided. Indoor restrooms are on site.
Straw is no longer offered by the site but you may bring in your own as desired.
There is no ice on site but it is for sale at stores minutes from the site.

Attention Sutlers and Traders

Sutlers only may set up after noon on the Thursday prior to the event and **must** check in at the Visitor Center prior to set up. If arrival is after 5:00 p.m. on Thursday, please check in on Friday.

Additional Regulations

Please carefully read these regulations for *Muster on the Maumee* and convey them to your unit members. These are an addendum to the existing site rules to make the event safer and more enjoyable for all involved. You will have to sign a form acknowledging you have read these regulations and agree to abide by them in order to participate in *Muster on the Maumee*.

1. **All Ages Battle** - The All Ages Battle will be held outside of the fort on the flood plain. There will be no fighting inside of the fort proper. Quiet hours start at 9:00 p.m. There will be no weapons firing after 9:00 p.m.
2. **Military Vehicles** - All self-propelled military vehicles must be approved in advance by the event organizers. All vehicles inside the fort will be stationary throughout the weekend. (Driving the vehicle into the fort Friday afternoon and driving the vehicle out of the fort on Sunday are permissible).
3. **Campfires** - Dug and on-ground campfires are only allowed in the ditches in front of the traverse, by State Order. Fires contained in braziers, removable fire boxes or on steel plates can be placed away from the traverses.
4. **Quiet Hours** - Quiet hours start at 9:00 p.m. No weapons firing can take place after 9:00 p.m.
5. **Unscripted Battles** - No unscripted battles will take place during operating hours (9 a.m. – 5 p.m.). All skirmishes using firing weapons (muskets, rifles, bows, etc) must be approved in advance and must be fought within the designated demonstration area. No impromptu skirmishes are allowed inside of the fort.
6. **South Gates** - The south gates (double gates) will be locked during operating hours. Anyone who needs to access their modern vehicles will have to use the west gate to enter or leave the fort.
7. **Vehicles** - All modern vehicles must be out of the fort and parked in the re-enactor parking lot by 8:30 a.m. Please refrain from driving your vehicle into the fort on Saturday night. It ruins the authenticity for others.
